Danilyn Rutherford is President of the Wenner-Gren Foundation for Anthropological Research. She received her bachelor's degree in biology and history from Stanford University and her doctorate in anthropology from Cornell University, and has taught at Goldsmiths College in London, the University of Chicago, and the University of California, Santa Cruz. Dr. Rutherford is the author of three books on West Papua, where she has conducted the bulk of her research: *Raiding the Land of the Foreigners: The Limits of the Nation on an Indonesian Frontier*, *Laughing at Leviathan: Sovereignty and Audience in West Papua*, and *Living in the Stone Age: Reflections on the Origins of a Colonial Fantasy*. Her current project is a study of belief and communication in the social worlds of adolescents with severe and profound intellectual disabilities.
