Speakers Short Bios:

Dr. Sharon Wong teaches courses on archaeology, museology, cultural heritage studies and Southeast Asian cultures at Department of Anthropology, The Chinese University of Hong Kong. She is currently working on a maritime ceramic road project between Angkor, Cambodia and China, and an intangible cultural heritage project on Hong Kong traditional ceramic crafts.

Mr. Nicky Wong holds BA (Arch Studies) Hons and Master of Architecture at The University of Hong Kong, and member of The Hong Kong Institute of Architects. Practicing architect for a wide variety of projects including heritage conservation in Hong Kong. Nicky has also been researching for heritages of Hong Kong.

Ms. Shita Lam received BSSc (Arch Studies) Hons and Master of Architecture and Master of Arts in Philosophy at The Chinese University of Hong Kong. Her interest lies within the realms of Sacral architecture. Lam discovered a disused underground service reservoir where she proposed a design for her Master's thesis.

Prof. Jim Crow teaches Roman and Byzantine archaeology at the University of Edinburgh, having lectured at Warwick and Newcastle Universities. He has directed excavations on Hadrian's Wall and he has studied the water supply of Byzantine Constantinople (Istanbul) since the 1990s. His research focuses on the interdisciplinary study of past cities working alongside engineers and geologists.

Mr. Stephen Clews has managed the Roman Baths at Bath for more than thirty years. He has a background in field archaeology and museums and is interested in developing interpretation and the art of balancing the needs of visitors, conservation and commercial development. He is a trustee of several heritage organisations.

Dr. Tim Greer is Adjunct Professor School of Architecture and Design, Sydney University and Director of Tonkin Zulaikha Greer Architects, responsible for the Paddington Reservoir Gardens. Tim's interest is in the continuum of architecture, and the overlapping of contemporary and historic buildings to frame and establish the public domain.
